Fire Service Visit

We enjoyed a visit from the fire service on 12th March; its always so much fun as the children get to climb onboard the fire engine and even have a go at squirting the hose in the park. We just managed to get the first 4 children on the engine and the firefighters got an emergency call: a very quick descent from the engine and they were gone! They did return about 20 minutes later after rescuing someone from an elevator.

Half the Duckling children spend the morning at Avondale and half at Kenley, swapping on alternate days. We still maintain a ratio of 1 adult to 4/5 children which is significantly lower than the legal ratio required of 1-8 for 3 year olds. It is lovely that so many families are wanting to join us but we are now full and will not be accepting any more pupils until September. Not all of the children in the current Duckling group will move up to the Ducks in September as they are on our early entry programme and will therefore stay in the Ducklings for the next academic year.
